Number of accessible parking spaces ?

Each designated parking space must be:

Number of accessible parking spaces

A van accessible parking space must be at least 9 feet wide with an adjacent access aisle that is at least 6 feet wide. Alternatively, a standard accessible parking space must be at least 8 feet wide with an adjacent access aisle that is at least 5 feet wide.

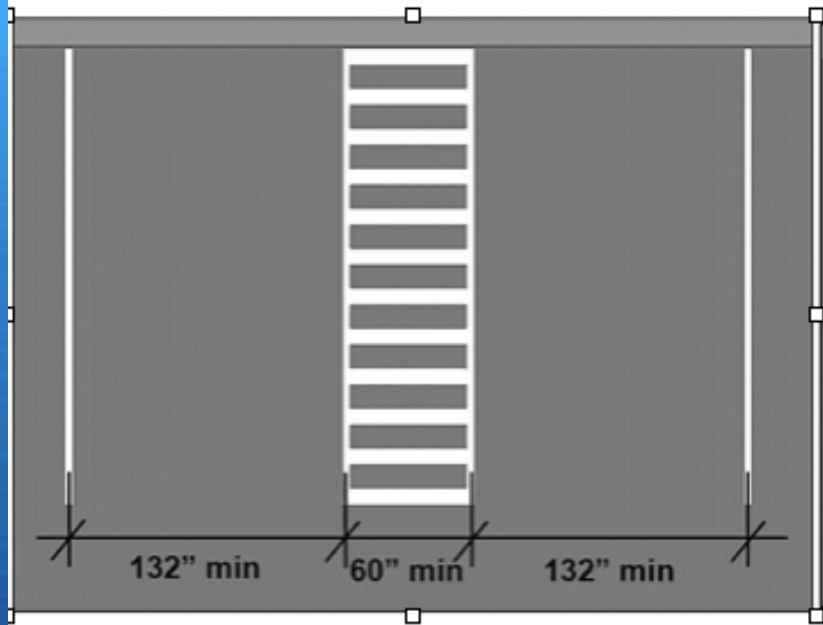
Ground surfaces of parking spaces and access aisles should not exceed 2% slope in any direction. Sign should be mounted on post (or building or wall) at minimum height of 60" from bottom of sign to ground.



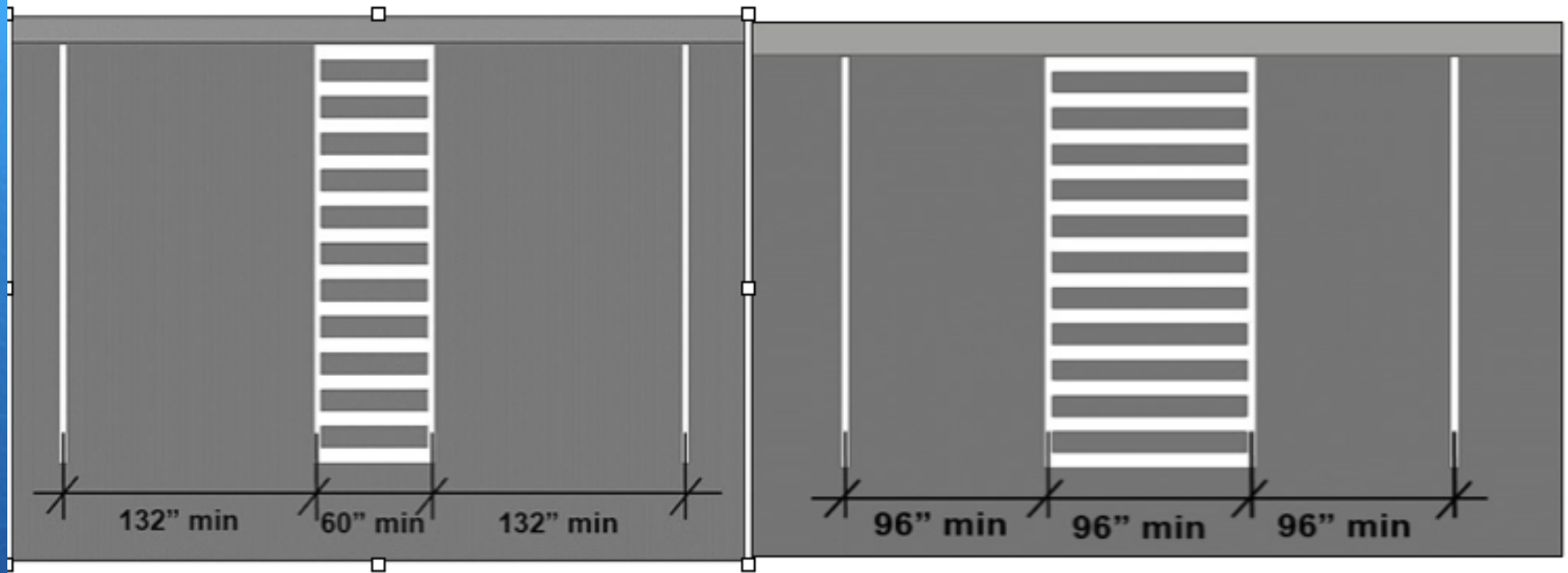
